### **Nominations are being accepted for Historic Preservation Award**

In observance of National Historic Preservation Month, nominations are now being accepted for the Annual Dr. Harvey Preservation Awards.

#### **Announcement:**

The City of Astoria is seeking nominations now through Wednesday, April 8, 2026 for the Annual Dr. Harvey Preservation Award, presented each May in observance of National Historic Preservation Month. The Dr. Harvey Award recognizes significant historic preservation projects that contribute to the preservation and architectural heritage in Astoria.

Citizens are encouraged to nominate a project or property owner who has made outstanding efforts to preserve historic buildings (work must have been completed within the last two years). Nomination forms can be downloaded from the [City's Forms page](#) or picked up at City Hall, 1095 Duane St., Astoria.

The Historic Landmarks Commission will review the nominations and determine winners based on the contributions of the project to the architectural and historical character to Astoria.
